The Mental Wellness Book Club

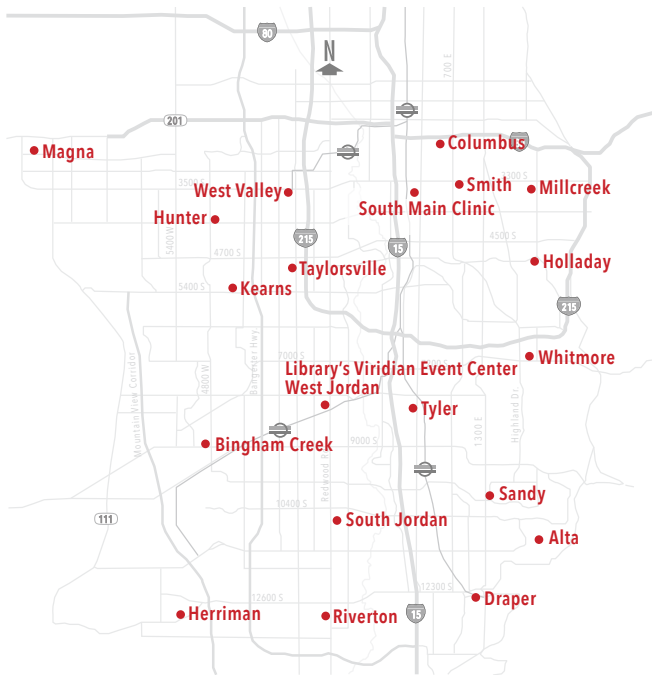
